#### Auction Floor Quality, Styles and Offerings:

•Offerings on the floor continue to be dominated by priming's and lugs, with increasing deliveries of cutters and leaf, these styles are naturally increasing as the season progresses. This year's crop is considered riper than the 2013 crop. On the lower quality lugs and leaf the crop is more wholesome and bodied even with the increase in ripeness compared to last year, which will translate into more balanced chemistries. The top end leaf and cutters that are coming in are predominantly riper than last year and we are seeing more runs of orange and orange-mahogany offerings of tobacco which are fetching higher prices than the lemon styles.

•As the selling season progresses the market seems to be finding stability. Overall the price is still staying lower than last year with lower to middle quality lugs fetching +/- 40c less than 2013 as well as the middle quality cutters being 50c - \$1.00 cheaper than the previous season. The top quality leaf is still firm with similarities to last year. These styles are fetching between \$4.00 and \$4.99.

•Up to week 5 we have seen a decrease in volume of 4,19 percentage compared to the increase of 15 percent in week 3 compared to 2013. This could be due to farmers holding back their tobacco hoping for the market price to increase as the season continues. The average price still remains down this year at \$2.60/kg, compared to last years \$3.60 at the same stage. In general the crop seems to be of better quality and with the average price being lower than last year, some reasonable value tobacco is on offer across the auction sales.



#### Contract Buying Floor Quality Styles and Offerings:


- •As predicted, there is a large increase in tobacco deliveries to contract of 20.25% over the last two weeks compared to that of 2013. These large volumes are expected to continue for the next few weeks as the Easter holidays approach.
- •The quality of tobacco on offer at the contract floors is improving with each passing week and as expected more leaf and cutters coming in of a high standard with good presentation, moisture content and soundness of tobacco. This shows that the farmers are adhering to the good presentation standards and zero tolerance of inorganic NTRM enforced by CTP. Although there is still room for improvement, a lot has been done to improve their presentation practices in order to eventually become compliant with our expectations in regard to the high integrity of the product.
- •To date a large increase of cutters and leaf have been received from the commercial and small scale farmers and is of exceptional quality. The grades are wholesome and have some good cutting qualities. The styles are showing a lot of promise in both quality and body in comparison to the 2013 crop with riper crops coming in showing an increase in full orange and orange-mahogany styles.
