Zimbabwean FCV Market Report as at 3rd April 2017

Crop Review:

Total crop production for the 2015/16 season was 201,953,546 kilograms. The estimated crop size for 2017 season is between 175 - 180 Million Kilograms. Total crop sold to date is 22,557,268 Kilograms.

Quality on Offer:

Commercial Growers:

Although small volumes of commercial crops have been seen to date, growers are producing top quality tobacco. There have been runs of open grained, soft, clean - orange styles on offer and they are fetching top prices between 4.20 - 5.20 US/KG respectfully.


Small Scale Growers:

The majority of tobacco being seen is from small scale growers, there are runs of lemon to light orange spotted tobacco. The styles on offer are soft, wholesome and oily which seem to have a slightly better nicotine and sugar balance from the previous season.

General Overview:

At this point tobacco quality is showing great potential compared to that of last year. With the Easter break approaching tobacco deliveries are expected to rise extremely quickly.

Contract Buying Floor Quality Styles and Offerings:

- 1. Lower reaps of the plant are generally softer and more wholesome compared to that of last season.
- Contract floors are being dominated by priming's and lugs most of which are full lemon to light orange, with majority carrying spot characteristics.
- Sponge is still a factor being seen on the contract floors, however green and running green tobacco is extremely minimal.
- 4. Small scale crops are still predominant on contract floors, large commercial crops are still to be seen.



Auction Floors:

- 1. Pricing on the auction floors still needs to find stability in these early stages of buying. The average price is still considerably higher than that of last season, with a 30.81% increase so far.
 - 2. Although priming's and lugs make upthe majority of the tobacco being seen on the auction floors, merchants have a profound appetite for this type of tobacco. This brings us to the hefty price increase of these qualities where they are fetching 40 50c more respectfully.
 - 3. We have also seen a 14.04% influx of tobacco deliveries in the past week. Reasons for this may be due to the increase in prices paid for lower styles of tobacco.
